

ONLINE STARDOM REGISTRATION GUIDE – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- An entry may be completed by the competitor or their parent/guardian or teacher.
- Teachers or School representatives may submit entries on behalf of all of their students on a single Registration Form. If entering a school, select 'School Representative' as your user type.
- Students of one teacher and all members of the one family maybe entered on one Registration Form
- Duets/Duos and Trios are to be entered by one competitor only. 'Confirm and lock in' these entries.

Getting Started

- Go to the Lismore Eisteddfod webpage: lismoreeisteddfod.com.au and click on the "STARDOM" link
- Signup for an account at the top right-hand of the homepage. Your secure login will now be available for current and future eisteddfods.
- Check and update your details for accuracy and administrative purposes.

How to enter

• From the list of eisteddfods on the left side of the homepage, choose the Lismore Eisteddfod and click enter competition


- Select the Discipline/s and Section/s you wish to enter. Read the relevant rules and complete the entry process online.
- A STARDOM administrative fee of \$2 per Registration Form (regardless of number of competitors) is charged only once per Registration Submission, so always use the "Save and Exit" option if you need to leave STARDOM before completing your entries. You can return later without any loss of information.
- There is a \$5 Lismore Eisteddfod Fee **per competitor/troupe/school group** on the Registration form to cover such costs as copyright etc.
- Multiple students can be entered on the same registration form
- Recheck all rules before completing payment
- Entries are only confirmed once payment has been received.

Payment information

- All Registration Payments must be in the Eisteddfod account by 5pm on the closing Date
- Allow time for Electronic Funds Transfer to be cleared. (Some banks take several days)
- Make payment to the Lismore Musical Festival Society **BSB: 032 539 Account Number:** 515506
- Use either your STARDOM invoice number or your contact name as your banking reference when using any of the following methods
 - a) Use online bank transfer directly to above account OR
 - b) Pay online via credit card in STARDOM (Credit card fees may apply)

All details entered are secured with an industry accredited SSL certificate on a fully secured Server. All logins are required to have a password that is based on industry standard complexity. The only Eisteddfods that know of your existence are those that you have entered.

SPEECH and DRAMA

1. Clear copies of own choice pieces

MUST be handed in BEFORE the session

in which the item will be presented or a competitor may be disqualified. If you cannot be present in time, please POST copies to the secretary to reach her in time.

2. ADJUDICATOR'S COPY

- (a) Set Pieces the Adjudicator must work from an original.
- (b) Own Choice the competitor may supply the adjudicator with a photocopy provided :-
 - (i) the original is used by the competitor for performance.
 - (ii) the Eisteddfod Committee destroy the copies immediately after the adjudication.

3. COMPETITOR'S COPY

If the competitor is not performing from memory, original or licensed photocopy must be used in the performance.

4. COPYRIGHT RULES & REGULATIONS

ENTRIES CLOSE 30 June 2023

ENTRIES

It is the responsibility of the entrant's teacher or parent to list the correct number of the sections and championships on the entry form using the 2023 syllabus.

All entries are submitted through Stardom on our website. The Committee deems no responsibility for entries received.

AGE of COMPETITOR

The age as at the 31 May 2023 shall be deemed to be the age of the competitor

All Championships (unless otherwise indicated in schedule) \$6

Other Sections (unless otherwise indicated in schedule) \$12

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competitor must enter the three (3) compulsory sections and a total fee of \$42.00 is required.

ie \$12.00 for each compulsory section and \$6.00 for championship section

Note: If entering for only I or 2 sections of the championship the fee is

\$12.00 each, as for other sections.

To win the championship the competitor must enter the three compulsory sections as listed below and gain the highest aggregate mark.

740. SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP (15-18 years)

Compulsory Sections 744, 745, 746.

ENTRY FEE: \$12.00 for each compulsory section and \$6.00 for championship section

Prize: First \$50, Second \$30, Third \$15

741. INTERMEDIATE CHAMPIONSHIP (13-14 years)

Compulsory Sections **755**, **756**, **757**

ENTRY FEE: \$12.00 for each compulsory section and \$6.00 for championship section

Prize: First \$50, Second \$30, Third \$15

742. JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP (12 years and under)

Compulsory Sections 765, 766, 767

ENTRY FEE: \$12.00 for each compulsory section and \$6.00 for championship section

Prize: First \$50, Second \$30, Third \$15

ALL ABILITIES SECTIONS

Maximum time limit - 4 minutes

These sections are intended to celebrate all abilities and diversity in our community through speech and dramatic performance.

The sections are for participation only and will not receive marks or placings.

Performers will receive an adjudication comment.

Performers may receive any assistance they need on the stage.

Our Schools and Vocal and Instrumental Competitions have sections for All Abilities musical performances.

This section is open to:

Performers who are visually impaired.

Performers who are hearing impaired.

Performers who have a communication challenges.

Performers with a learning or cognitive disability.

Performers with a mental health or emotional challenge.

Performers with limited mobility.

ALL ABILITIES SOLO SECTIONS 13-18 YEARS

790. VERSE SPEAKING - own choice

791. WRITE AND READ OWN POEM or PROSE

Poems to be given feedback on both the composition and the reading. A typed copy of the poem, and a signed statement that the poem is the competitor's own composition, to be handed in before the session.

792. DRAMATIC PERFORMANCE Limited props. Deletions to be made so one character speaks.

ALL ABILITIES SOLO SECTIONS 12 YEARS and UNDER

793. VERSE SPEAKING - own choice

794. WRITE AND READ OWN POEM or PROSE

Poems to be given feedback on both the composition and the reading. A typed copy of the poem/prose, and a signed statement that it is the competitor's own composition, to be handed in before the session.

795. DRAMATIC PERFORMANCE Limited props. Deletions to be made so one character speaks.

SENIOR SOLO SECTIONS (15-18 YEARS)

Maximum time limit – 4 1/2 minutes unless otherwise stated.

752. WRITE AND READ OWN POEM or PROSE.

To be judged on both the composition and the reading.

A typed copy of the poem/prose, and a signed statement that it is the competitor's own composition, to be handed in before the session.

753. NEWS REPORTING Lismore Musical Festival Society will email a script for a news report after entries have been finalised. A chair and table will be provided.

754. INDIVIDUAL MIME The story is conveyed through movement and nonverbal dramatic elements. No sound. Props not permitted. A title card is to be displayed before starting. *Time limit of 3 minutes.*

INTERMEDIATE SECTION (13-14 YEARS)

Maximum time limit - 4 minutes unless otherwise stated.

755. PREPARED TALK (Championship Qualifier) NOT to be read

756. VERSE SPEAKING - own choice (*Championship Qualifier*) **757. DRAMATIC PERFORMANCE in COSTUME** (*Championship Qualifier*)

Limited props Deletions to be made so only one character speaks.

Poems to be judged on both the composition and the reading. A typed copy of the poem, and a signed statement that the poem is the competitor's own composition, to be handed in before the session.

771. INDIVIDUAL MIME The story is conveyed through movement and nonverbal dramatic elements. No sound. Props not permitted. A title card is to be displayed before starting. *Time limit of 3 minutes.*

JUNIOR SECTION (6 Years & under)

Maximum time limit - 2 minutes unless otherwise stated.

772. CHARACTER RECITAL

Acted nursery rhyme, poem, prose or drama to be performed in costume.

773. VERSE SPEAKING - own choice

DRAMATIC DUOLOGUES -ENTRY FEE \$16.00

A dramatic performance with two actors.

Please note on your Entry Form, with whom you will be acting and **MAKE ONE ENTRY** with **BOTH COMPETITORS NAMES** on the entry form. Costume essential. Props and scenery must be simple and easily set up.

774. 18 YEARS & UNDER
775. 14 YEARS & UNDER
776. 12 YEARS & UNDER
Maximum time limit - 5 mins.

DRAMATISED SCENE - ENTRY FEE \$16.00

Play, sketch or dramatised scene.

Group of three or more, but a maximum of five performers.

MAKE ONE ENTRY with ALL COMPETITORS NAMES on the entry

form. Costume essential.

Props and scenery must be simple and easily set up.

777. 13 - 18 YEARS Maximum time limit - 7 mins
778. 12 YEARS & UNDER Maximum time limit - 5 mins

2023 REVISED RULES GOVERNING THE SPEECH AND DRAMA COMPETITIONS

Competitors are asked to study the following rules carefully as they will be strictly enforced. This applies particularly to the submission of entry forms which will be rejected if they do not comply. It should be noted that:

- Entries are submitted through Stardom on our website www.lismoreeisteddfod.com.au
- 1. In these rules and conditions the word "Committee" shall mean "The Management Committee of the Lismore Musical Festival Society".
- 2. The decision of the Committee in all questions arising, shall be final. All entries are deemed to be made subject to these conditions.
- 3. The Committee reserves the right to determine the Status of any competitor and the application and interpretation of these rules.
- 4. In the event of insufficient or large entries, the Committee reserves the right to combine or divide sections accordingly. In any section where insufficient entries are received the Committee may exercise its discretion with regard to the retention or the alteration of any section for that year.
- 5. The Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time by varying the order of the competitors or sections at any session.
- 6. All competitions are intended for amateurs. Teachers may not perform.
- 7. All competitors perform entirely at their own risk.
- 8. AGE: In all competitions the age as at the 31 May 2023 shall be deemed to be the age of the competitor
- 9. The Committee reserves the right in age competitions to call upon any competitor to produce at his/her own expense, PROOF OF AGE and to withhold any prize/money until such proof shall have been furnished.
- 10. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, and, in particular, those from competitors

- who have been pupils of an adjudicator, within a period of 12 months prior to the closing of entries. These competitors are not eligible to compete in any section judged by that adjudicator.
- 11. Competitors will be regarded as being CONVERSANT WITH THE RULES of the competitions of the Society affecting their positions as competitors. The PLEA OF LACK OF KNOWLEDGE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS A BONA FIDE REASON FOR THE INFRINGEMENT OF THE RULE. In the event of a protest being lodged the competitors so infringing shall be liable to disqualification or may otherwise be dealt with by the Committee.
- 12. Entries in all sections must be lodged online by the date advertised for the closing of entries. No entry will be accepted without its full entry fee.
- 14. In all sections where two or more combine to compete e.g. duos, duets, trios, the name of each competitor must be given at the time of entry. Non-compliance with this rule will render the entry liable to rejection.
- 15. In sections where there are two (2) or more competitors competing in combination, NO competitor may compete more than once in any capacity. No competitor shall be allowed to render the same item in more than one (1) section.
- 16. Competitors **MUST** perform in OWN age sections and not outside their own age group, unless specifically indicated in the schedule as open to all ages (unrestricted).
- 17. It is not necessary to name OWN CHOICE items on the entry forms.
- 18. In OWN CHOICE sections, copies of pieces for use of the Adjudicator must be handed to the Spoken Word table secretary immediately prior to the commencement of the SESSION (morning, afternoon or night) in which the item is to be heard.
- 19. In OWN SELECTION competitions, marks will be awarded for quality of choice. Very lengthy selections will not improve the competitor's chance of success and teachers are advised to take note of this.
- 22. Time Limits. Vocal/Instrumental and Spoken Word Competitors please read Schedules for time limits
- 24. CHAMPIONSHIP: Competitors must enter and perform in their corresponding AGE, or acceptable qualifying section/s as indicated in the schedule before the Championship is held.
- 26. The Adjudicator's decision shall be final and he/she has the power to withhold or divide prizes according to merit. He/she shall also be entitled to recommend the awarding of a second place if he/she thinks the rendition has not sufficient merit to carry a first prize, but he/she shall intimate his/her decision when making the adjudication.
- 27. In many cases only part of a song, recitation or instrumental item may be heard by the Adjudicator and the bell does not necessarily signify disapproval or rejection. The Adjudicator's objective will be to hear all items at the session in which they are set down.
- 29. If through unforeseen circumstance an Adjudicator is unable to perform his/her duty, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute
- 30. Competitors must assemble in the space provided by the committee and must be ready to render their items in the order in which their names appear in the program. Any delay on their part causing disruption of the business of the session will render them liable to disqualification.
- 31. No teacher will be allowed on stage with a competitor unless as an accompanist FOR THAT ITEM. Prompting from the audience or side of stage is strictly forbidden and is liable to result in disqualification of that competitor.
- 40. Usage of venues or equipment PRIOR to the Eisteddfod is not the responsibility of the Lismore Musical Festival Society. All rehearsals should be privately arranged by and paid for by the

competitor with the appropriate authority.

- 41. No use of the stage for practice is permitted at any venue during the competitions.
- 42. During the actual competitions all enquiries of, or representations to, the Adjudicator must be made in writing either through the Secretary or a Committee member.
- 43. UNAUTHORISED communication with the Adjudicator during the competition is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. Failure to comply will mean immediate disqualification.
- 44. **PROTESTS**: If any, shall be lodged with the Secretary in writing, within one hour after completion of section in respect of which the protest is entered and must be accompanied by \$50.00 which shall be forfeited if the protest is deemed to be frivolous or unfounded.
